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THE STORY OF AHAYAH ACADEMY

Ahayah Academy was founded in 2016 in response to a deep rooted passion of the founders to open a school to meet the needs of the community. The school was built on the idea that education is the equalizer to combat all sorts of injustice and that the minds of the young can be cultivated in ways that make a profound impact on society.

THE NAME

The word *Ahayah* means “I Am” in Hebrew. When Moses of the Bible encountered a burning bush and was instructed to bring the children of Israel out of Egypt, Moses asked the Most High, who shall I say sent me. The Most High’s response was “I AM THAT I AM” (Exodus 3: 11-14). *Ahayah* was selected because we expect the Most High to continue to bring his children out of all states of bondage. The word *Academy* refers to an institution. With these two words, the essence of *Ahayah Academy* was formed.

We are a learning institution committed to exposing our student body to a quality education that helps them to understand the world they live in and acquire and maintain a commitment to continuous development in positive and safe learning environments. We embrace a student-centered learning model. This means, we seek to develop students who have a commitment to their own learning. Our teachers are required to be subject matter experts in the subject matter they teach, but our students and teachers are responsible for ensuring the students learn. To ensure they do, we have various checkpoints in lessons, interactive exercises, group activities, and discussions. Bloom’s Taxonomy is applied to our curriculum to ensure the appropriate levels of rigor.

OUR VISION

To be a prominent learning institution where students achieve their highest potential through an understanding of God, self, and community; resulting from scholastic exposure and triumph.

OUR MISSION

Our Mission is to educate learners of all ages to develop the skills and competencies necessary to emerge as positive contributors to society; supported by an array of learning programs.

Ahayah Academy (AA) was created to nurture, heal, and encourage the student body in ways that help them overcome challenges through early intervention, use of the most recent technology, and committed educators.

We believe that The Most High God has given everyone a purpose and we exist to help those entrusted to us accomplish His divine calling for their lives. We accomplish this through ensuring we operate a biblically driven learning environment that is enhanced through daily

prayer, weekly chapel service, rigorous learning programs, community involvement, and extra curriculum activities; designed to develop and enhance critical thinking, analytical skills, and application of knowledge.

Ahayah Academy is Cognia formerly known as Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) accredited and accredited by the National Association of Private Schools (NAPS).

DRESS CODE & PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

At *Ahayah Academy*, it is important to us that students have as little distractions as possible at school so they are able to focus on learning. For this reason, *Ahayah Academy* requires students to wear a school uniform. Students will have special dress down days that will be communicated at those designated times.

Note: Students must come to school with clean and neat attire.

Boys are to wear black, blue, or khaki pants or shorts (school uniform bottoms only) with a black, purple, or golden-yellow polo/collar shirt. The academy logo is required on the purple and black polo/collar shirts. Wednesdays are reserved for chapel day. On this day, boys are to wear the chapel uniform which consists of Khaki or black pants/shorts with the purple or black polo/collar shirt (with logo). A belt must be worn; sagging pants are not allowed!

Girls are to wear a black, blue, or khaki school uniform dress, skirt, pants, or shorts with a black, purple, or golden-yellow polo/collar shirt. The academy logo is required on the purple and black polo/collar shirt only. Wednesdays are reserved for chapel day. On this day, girls are to wear the chapel uniform which consists of a black or Khaki dress/skirt with the purple or black shirt (with logo).

Note: Dresses and skirts cannot be higher than 1 inch above the knee. The longer, the better.

Boys: Belts are required and should be appropriate with conservative buckles. Other garments, such as coats gloves, etc. may be the choice of the student, but cannot be worn while in the classroom. Such items are to be stored in the designated area. Ahayah Academy jackets are permitted in the classroom. Dirty, soiled, stained, badly faded, excessively worn or wrinkled garments are strongly discouraged.

Basic hairstyle for boys:

1. Neat and trim at all times. Neat braids, dreadlocks, etc. are allowed
2. Off the shoulders and off the ear no more than four (4) inches of bulk thickness on the top of the head (2) inches bulk on the sides and back
3. No “punk” hairstyles (meaning defined spikes) or hair that is not the student’s natural color
4. No visible body piercings
5. No hats /hoods or caps worn indoor
6. No inappropriate jewelry

Girls: Elementary school girls are not permitted to wear make-up at school. Hair color, and nail polish must be complimentary to skin complexion. Jewelry should be worn in moderation.

Basic hairstyles for girls:

1. Hair is to be neat and clean at all times. Braids, dreadlocks, etc. are allowed
2. Hair color must be natural or match complexion

ACADEMIC PROGRAM OPTIONS

Traditional Classroom: This is a traditional on-site program where students come to school following the academic calendar for the school year. Students are provided with a school issued laptop that is for in school use only and remains the property of Ahayah Academy. If a student damages or breaks a laptop, the family is responsible for replacing it.

Virtual Synchronous Classroom Program: The *Virtual Classroom* program is a program that allows students to attend Ahayah Academy virtually by logging into a virtual classroom, receive instruction from a teacher, and work with other students in virtual classrooms and virtual groups; real time.

Home School Program: The *Home School* program is a program that allows students to attend Ahayah Academy virtually by logging into a virtual classroom and completing the curriculum at their own pace within a set time frame with support from their families. Our interactive curriculum is very helpful and provides audio and visual instruction for students.

SCHOOL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

ADMISSION & ENROLLMENT

Ahayah Academy is a non-discriminatory private school. Our doors are open to all who seek to learn with us and adhere to the policies and procedures established for this institution.

PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT

Parental engagement and oversight is required in order for your scholar to be successful. A responsible adult is required to be close by the student in grades K-2 throughout their scheduled instruction time. All gradable items must be submitted by the due dates provided in the format requested. For students in grades 3-12, parents are required to register for their parental account so weekly monitoring of student progress can be viewed. Parents are expected to read reports and work with the teachers to help address any student performance challenges.

Admission Procedures

1. Schedule a tour of the school
2. Submit an application for admission via the website or the main office
 - a. Schedule appointment to complete assessment (student completes assessment)
 - b. Schedule a family interview (ideally the same day as the assessment)
3. Health Requirements

- a. Kindergarten students must be age 5 by September 1 of a given year to enroll in kindergarten (some exceptions apply).
 - b. Student identity must be verifiable with a birth certificate and appropriate immunization records.
 - c. Legal guardianship must be proven by the adult enrolling the student(s).
 - d. All children entering school for the first time must show documentation of having received a comprehensive health screening examination within the past 12 months; provide documentation of up-to-date immunizations prior to admittance to school.
 - e. If a student is not vaccinated for religious or medical reasons, documentation is required.
4. Admission Classification Categories: Students who seek out *Ahayah Academy* come from differing backgrounds and experiences. For this reason, admission to the school can be regular admission or academic/behavioral probation. If it becomes apparent that *Ahayah Academy* is not a good fit a student, disenrollment may result.
- a. Students accepted on academic/behavioral probation will be required to meet all conditions set forth on a contract. Students not meeting the required conditions by the set date on the contract will be released from the school.
5. Student Acceptance to *Ahayah Academy*
- a. Once the registration fee has been received and the aforementioned tasks have been accomplished, a student acceptance letter will be provided to the family.
 - b. Parents or legal guardians of the student(s) will set-up a tuition payment plan with the school's business office.
 - c. If the student's class is full, the student can be placed on a waiting list.
6. Continuing Student Enrollment
- Continuing students must reapply for enrollment each school year. Admission and enrollment is not automatic. All qualified students will be admitted on a first-come basis. Students will not be allowed to begin school until all records, forms, payment requirements and any delinquent fees are satisfied.
- Continuing student applications will be available by December of a given year for the next school year.
- a. Complete and submit the application online or submit to the main office.
 - b. Submit registration fee to the business office.
 - c. Contracts are honored on a yearly basis; therefore, early withdrawal may result in full payment due immediately.

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- Tuition is due by the 10th day of each month. Each tuition payment received after the 10th of the month is considered late and will be assessed a 10% late fee.
- Tuition paid in full at the start of the year will receive a 4% discount on total tuition.

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

Onsight

Below are some important specifics related to attendance requirements by the county.

- a. Five (5) days of unexcused absences places the student in a state of truancy.
- b. Students are considered tardy if they arrive after the official start of the class period.
- c. A school social worker will be contacted if a student has 15 unexcused tardies.
- d. Proof of a written excuse for an absence must be received within 5 days post return to school for the excused absence to be recorded.

Virtual Programs

For virtual programs, student attendance is measured according to work completion.

Children are required to attend Ahayah Academy for a minimum of 180 days or its equivalent to be credited with a full year of school. Every class session missed is a learning opportunity lost. However, we are aware there are instances where a student will need to miss school.

Before School Care: School begins at 8:00 am but students can be dropped off as early as 6:30 am for before school care. Before school care ends at 7:45 am. If students arrive between 7:45 and 8:00 am, there is no fee associated with these times of arrival. **After School Care:** School ends at 2:30 pm. Students who remain on campus at the end of the car line will be taken to After School Care until they are picked up.

After School Care starts at 3:00 pm and ends at 6:00 pm. If students remain on campus after 6:30 pm, there will a \$5.00 fee per minute added until the child is picked up.

STUDENT MEALS

Ahayah Academy does not provide lunch at this time. Students will need to pack a lunch and two (2) snacks each day. Snacks can be purchased as outlined below.

Note: Students covered under the food program will be provided lunch at no cost to the family.

Every student must have lunch. Snacks brought from home should be healthy. Ideally, lunch should to include a protein, water, juice, fruit, and a snack; at a minimum. Please make sure your child has arrangements for lunch before coming to school. We reserve the right to continue or discontinue the sale of lunches, based on enrollment status.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from school is the sole responsibility of the parent/guardian or their designated representative. The parent/guardian must have turned in a designation letter in order for a designated representative to pick up or drop off a child. Letters should be turned in to the school office.

PARENT/GUARDIAN INVOLVEMENT

Students spend most of their days in school and at home. Ensuring healthy relationships exists between parents/guardians and the learning institution is imperative to ensure the academic needs of the students are met. To assist in this matter, parents/guardians are requested to give five (5) hours a quarter of their time to the school.

Periodic supply donations to the school would also be appreciated when requested. We do not want our students learning to be negatively impacted in any way.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS

General Rules

Ahayah Academy is a learning institution and we strive to ensure we have an environment that is conducive to learning. Therefore, it is our expectation that each student come to school with the intention to learn.

- Any activities not directly related to learning are strictly prohibited unless approved by your teacher.
- Follow the class rules provided by your teacher.
- Students are not allowed to leave the school without teacher/staff permission.

Progress Reports

The grading system of our school is designed to give parents a true indication of the students' progress or lack thereof. Progress reports are issued at the end of each semester. Students may also receive a progress report to indicate positive achievement at any time.

Conduct Reports

Students receive conduct reports on a weekly basis. These reports should be viewed as tools that permit parents or guardians to partner with *Ahayah Academy* for the success of our students.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

“To him that knoweth to do good and doeth it not, to him it is sin (James 4:17)”. “Let the word of my mouth, and the mediation of my heart be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord (Psalm 19:14)”. Students are expected to behave in an orderly manner, maintaining biblical standards of courtesy, kindness, language, morality, and honesty. Any student observing questionable activities or overhearing conversations contrary to biblical standards should immediately tell an adult, teacher, or staff member. This is not tattling. Inappropriate behaviors and all violations against school policy are to be reported to the appropriate authorities, in an effort to assess and correct the behavior.

Cell Phone Usage

Cell phones are not permitted for use during the school hours. There will be a receptacle located in each classroom for students to place their phones in when entering the classroom. We want to ensure that the students' attention is on learning.

Note: Cell phones are permissible at the direction of the teacher; for school related activities.

Sexual Conduct

Students are not to engage in any physical activity while on campus that can be misconstrued or characterized as sexual aggression. This means, there is no kissing, holding hands, hugging, sitting on the lap of anyone, no use of sexual language, etc. Engaging in such activities is a matter of grave concern and can result in expulsion from school or the involvement of law enforcement. Remember, do not let your good be evil spoken of (Romans 14:16).

Weapons & Drugs

Weapons are not permitted on campus by students or families for any reason. We have a zero-tolerance policy regarding weapons. Threats of violence and bullying are not permitted. We operate a safe environment and will not permit anyone to disrupt the safety and security of any of our stakeholders.

Any student found to be in possession of weapons, alcohol, tobacco products or drugs will be immediately dismissed from the academy pending an investigation from the school board. Any student found to be using alcohol, tobacco or drugs on or off school property, during school hours, will be dismissed immediately. Parents/guardians will have the right to appeal to the school board. Re-admittance will be reviewed **ONLY** after successful counseling has taken place. The school will require documentation of successful counseling.

Virtual Protocol

Students are encouraged to use appropriate virtual backgrounds. The background noise should be minimal. Television and radio should not be on. Students are not to be in bed when on camera.

Discipline Procedures

We are here to work with the parents/guardians and students, not take the place of parents or guardians. Children who are unable to conform to the high Christian standards of behavior expected at *Ahayah Academy* will have their case brought before an academic/ disciplinary review board to determine whether our academy is the proper learning environment for the

student. If your child has a complaint about a policy or a disciplinary action, please follow these procedures:

- a. Give the teacher/staff the benefit of the doubt.
- b. Realize that your child's report may be emotionally biased and may not include all the facts.
- c. Realize that the school has a reason for all of its rules and these rules are enforced without prejudice.
- d. Support the faculty and administration; call the school for the facts.
- e. Be encouraged to schedule a conference.

At *Ahayah Academy*, discipline is firm, consistent, fair and tempered with love. Our teachers/staff maintain standards of behavior in the classroom through kindness, love and genuine regard for our students. However, when disciplinary action becomes necessary they will be executed with the goal of correcting the behavior or actions of the student in order for the student to remain a member of the student body.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

School will be closed in case of severe weather conditions. Student safety is our primary concern. Therefore, closing information will be posted on local news stations and via the school message blast system.
